In this course we will be learning about the history and development of various countries around the world. We will also be confronted with the realization that nations of the world are interdependent. Therefore, in order to fully understand other parts of the world and why they are the way they are today, it is important to study the historical events that shaped their lives and how in times of crisis they come together.
