

Tips for Good Vocal Health in Children

Voice disorders affect about four to six children out of 100. Voice disorders refer to a range of problems that affect the quality of sound. You might notice that your child's voice sounds hoarse, breathy, nasal, or too high or low. Voice disorders in children often occur due to abuse of the vocal cords. Try to help your child keep his or her voice in shape with the following tips from the experts:

- Encourage your child to keep hydrated by drinking at least 2 glasses of water per day.
- Ask your child to take a sip of water instead of clearing his or her throat. Clearing your throat can be irritating to the vocal cords.
- Discourage yelling, screaming, excessive shouting, talking over people or background noise (e.g. the TV) and speaking in a screechy and harsh manner.


- •If we miss a lesson day due to a full day school closing, we will have that lesson on the day we return to school. We do not skip letter days. The missed letter day happens when we return.
