Principal's Report

- Welcome.

Treasurer's Report

Introduction and proposed budget.

- The Halloween event is an updated event. A survey was launched for interest in the event. There is currently no chair. A trunk or treat was proposed and was explained by Emily. It is scheduled for 10/28 from 6:30pm to 8pm with a raindate approved tentatively. The trunk or treat will be held in the new lot and bus circle. Vehicles must be registered with a possible fee. The PTA can still do their own activities on the sidewalk and in the field. The regular lot will still be used for parking. There is limited

lighting from the parking lot and school. Other lighting would have to be provided. A photo of a trunk or treat was displayed along with survey results. Some raised concerns over weather and loss of social, while others showed interest in the new idea. Jill motioned to approve trunk or treat, Tricia seconded, and the motion passed with a vote.
